Social Thinking at NGES

What is Social Thinking? Simply put - - - Social Thinking = ME + YOU= US

NGES adopted the Social Thinking curriculum called *We Thinkers!* at the universal level starting in 4K, and we have been incorporating it into the fabric of our language at the elementary school.

- •The Social Thinking teaching framework is designed to help kids who may struggle with social skills, but is beneficial for all students.
- •Social Thinking teaches kids how to figure out what other people may be thinking and feeling.
- •Building these skills can lead to better social interactions for students throughout their lifetime.



We Thinkers! (Volume 1) has five concepts:

- 1. Thinking Thoughts and Feeling Feelings
 - 2. The Group Plan
 - 3. Thinking with Your Eyes
 - 4. Body in the Group
 - 5. Whole Body Listening



What is an ELO?



ELO stands for Essential Learning Outcome. ELOs are the benchmark skills you see on your child's report card.

How are ELOs determined or where did they come from?

In both ELA (English Language Arts) and math, we have reviewed the core standards at each grade level. The number of standards is quite extensive. Teacher teams have worked to determine the most important or non-negotiable learning standards at each grade level. While there are many skills to teach and learn, the ELOs are the most essential skills students must have in order to be successful.

How are ELOs used?

What is essential for students to know drives both the daily universal instruction for all students and provides clear direction for additional support during intervention time. We want all students to be proficient with the ELOs for their grade level. There are many more skills that are taught and practiced at each grade level, but ELOs are the most important building blocks for a solid foundation of learning.

Last month the Kindergarten/1st grade ELOs were shared. On the next page are the 2nd and 3rd grade ELOs for literacy and math.

Forward Testing

The Forward Test is the state of Wisconsin's yearly assessment for all students in grades 3-8 and 10. It is taken in the spring of each year.

This year our 3rd, 4th, and 5th in-person students will take the Forward Test **April 13th-16th**.

Virtual students in grades 3rd-5th will also take the Forward exam at school per state requirements. We are planning for virtual students to take the test when other students are NOT in the building - on Mondays in April. More details and exact dates and times will be sent home the week of March 15th.

All families will receive a letter with more information in the mail the week of March 15th.

If families have attended previous Child Development Days and feel their child is ready to start 4K in the fall, there is no need to make an appointment with school staff.


More specific details, dates, and information regarding 4K registration will be sent directly to families of our incoming 4K students later in March.
